Onsite sewage management system permits are valid for 12 months from the date of issue according to the Rules and Regulations for the State of Georgia, Chapter 511-3-1-.03(3). (See applicable initial permit fee schedule.) If a property owner or builder comes in to renew a residential septic permit just prior to the expiration date and this is the first renewal, there will be a \$100.00 re-evaluation charge and a site visit will need to be performed prior to issuance. The property owner must also have proof of a building permit and at least a "rough" inspection. If a permit has expired or has been renewed once before, the initial fee will apply for a new permit and a site visit will need to be performed prior to issuance of the permit. If a permit has never been issued, the permit expires 12 months from the application date. The above fees are subject to change to reflect the current fee schedule.

Pump system permits and Advanced Treatment System permit fees are \$550.00. This will include new system permits, replacement system permits and addition/modification permits. All surface and/or ground water must be diverted around sewage system.

There must be sufficient space on the property to install a primary and backup conventional on-site sewage system for previously undeveloped lots.

As of 2/20/2000, any person/persons installing on-site sewage management systems must be certified by the State or an approval for the system will not be issued.

When installing a new system or a repair, if there are indications of unsuitable soils or other concerns please cease work and notify the Hall County Environmental Health Department. Sediment and soil erosion controls must be sufficient and remain in place.

Inlet and outlet tees must be in place at the time of inspection. If inlet plumbing is not hooked to the building at time of inspection, inlet tee must be cemented or secured to tank.

A repair permit is issued to correct a failing septic system. If no portion of the existing system can be utilized and the entire system is replaced, the property owner is responsible for the additional permit fee prior to any approval of the system. For all systems including repairs, the amount of drain line must accommodate the number of bedrooms.

If crossing drain line, water lines must be installed 12" above aggregate layer and encased in a single length of pipe 10' from drain lines.

Any modification to the lot that would adversely affect the on-site sewage management system or the replacement area could render the permit or the final approval void.

In the event an on-site sewage management system, alternative system or soil fill installation is installed, notice shall be delivered to the owner of such property and in the event of new construction homes or commercial buildings, notice must be delivered to new owner, by the homebuilder/contractor, at the time of conveyance on such property stating the type of installation, design and maintenance needs.

#### Advanced Treatment Systems:

1. Owners of an Advanced Treatment System are responsible for renewing their annual operating permit. The following information must be submitted and in compliance before the permit renewal date:
  - a. Copy of the current and renewal service agreement.
  - b. Copy of the maintenance contractor's certification.
  - c. Copies of the service inspection reports.If the proper paperwork is submitted as required, the Environmental Health office will mail the renewal of the operating permit to the current homeowner.
2. If the proper paperwork is not submitted prior to the renewal date, the Environmental Health office will notify the owner. If the paperwork is turned in within 30 days of notification and is in compliance, the Advanced Treatment Systems Operating Permit will be renewed and mailed to the current homeowner.
3. If the proper paperwork is not turned in within 30 days or is not in compliance, a re-inspection will be performed. The current re-inspection fee will be applicable. The department will notify the current owner that the operating permit is revoked and initiate enforcement action.

Issuance of a construction permit for an on-site sewage management system and subsequent approval of same by representatives of the Georgia Department of Public Health or County Board of Health shall not be construed as a guarantee that such systems will function satisfactorily for a given period of time. Furthermore, said representatives do not by any action in effecting compliance with these rules, assume any liability for damages which are caused, or which may be caused, by the malfunction of such system.

I hereby apply for a construction permit to install an on-site sewage management system and agree that the system will be installed to conform to the requirements of the rules of the Georgia Department of Public Health, Chapter 511-3-1. I have read and will comply with the additional requirements printed above. I understand that final inspection is required and will notify the Hall County Environmental Health Department upon completion of construction and before applying final cover.
